80% Wadenswil Block 31, 20% Dijon 115 from Block 11 25% Whole cluster, native primary yeast, naturally occurring malolactic bacteria, minimal effective so2.

Organically driven from vineyard to bottle. Sorted by hand in the vineyard and winery, fermented in small open top 1.5ton fermenters, aged 18 months in French oak barrels, sur lie élevage.
